

THE JAMES M. COLLIER ORCHESTRAL FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM 2019 CALL FOR ENTRIES | BRITT FESTIVAL ORCHESTRA

The **James M. Collier Orchestral Fellowship Program** provides aspiring violinists, violists, and cellists with the unique opportunity to explore professional career paths for musicians in the 21st century. Under the baton of **Music Director & Conductor Teddy Abrams** and the **Artistic Advisor & Mentor Alexandra Preucil** all orchestral fellows will:

- Rehearse and perform as part of our Britt Festival Orchestra
- Form a string quartet and perform in the southern Oregon community.
- Receive coaching, mentorship, and private lessons from members of the Britt Festival Orchestra.

The 2019 fellowships will begin on July 17th and end on August 12th.

Each fellow is provided with a stipend of \$1,000 for living expenses during the fellowship period, a \$600 travel reimbursement (cartage assistance available for cello), and housing.

We are now accepting applications for the following positions:

Violin: 2 positions | Viola: 1 position | Cello: 1 position

Who May Apply

Anyone who is 18 years or older currently pursuing their degree in music, and does not currently hold a position in a major orchestra.

How To Apply

- Provide a current CV
- Provide at least 2 letters of recommendation from a professor and/or private instructor.
- Provide a single page cover letter outlining the reasons for your interest in and readiness for this program, addressing the following questions:
 - What are your personal and professional goals as an artist?
 - What role does the contemporary musician play in the community both as a musician and as a teaching artist?
- Provide recorded audition excerpts
